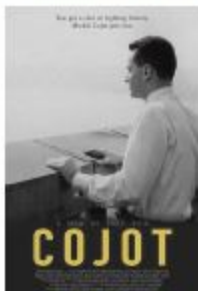

Cojot embodies the modern era's vital dilemmas: how to lead a purposeful life and reconcile

Western ideals of liberty, equality and justice with the bitter memories of WWII and the rise of global terrorism.

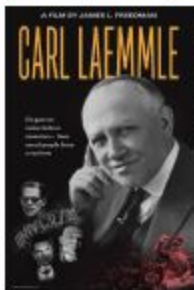
