Jewish Summer Camp Award – up to \$250

Children who attend a Jewish Summer Camp may apply for an award up to \$250 toward the cost of camp tuition. Applications are due no later than April 15, for the following summer. Campers will be asked to submit a photo and paragraph describing their experience to submit to our *Shalom* publication.

Leadership Training Award – up to \$150

High school students that enroll in leadership training programs through Jewish youth movements such as BBYO (B'nai B'rith Youth Organization) or USY (United Synagogue Youth) may apply for an award up to \$150 toward the cost of registration and travel. One award per student per year. **Requests must be made no less than 60 days prior to the start of the training program.** Please contact Brian Chartock at the Federation office at 610-921-0624 to apply.

<u>High School Israel Experience Award – up to \$250</u>

High school students who participate in programs such as *Ramah in Israel* or *NFTY in Israel* that are designed to provide students with a meaningful and exciting Israel experience may apply for an award up to \$250 toward the cost of registration and travel. Recipients will be asked to provide a current photo and write a brief article for inclusion in the *Shalom* newspaper (experience photos welcomed) upon your return. **Deadline for application – April 15 for the following summer.** Please contact Brian Chartock at the Federation office at 610-921-0624 to apply.

<u>College and Post Graduate Study in Israel Award – up to \$500</u>

College and post-graduate students enrolled in academic study programs in Israel or who wish to pursue internship opportunities in Israel are invited to apply for awards to accredited colleges/universities up to \$500. Due to the uniqueness of many internship opportunities, requests will be evaluated on an individual basis. When possible, recipients will be asked to join a Federation function (board meeting/event) and talk about their experience. **Deadline for applications – 60 days prior to the start of the program.**Summer programs and internships, deadline for application - May 15 for the following summer.
