Learn about Sir Nicholas Winton, a Gentile rescuer of Jewish children prior to WWII in Czechoslovakia. Winton's actions saved hundreds of lives and led to many new interfaith projects. When Ayyash accidentally drops his stash into the mixing dough, the challah starts flying off the shelves and an unlikely friendship forms between the old Jewish baker and his young Muslim apprentice.
