



2021 COVID POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Camp J is proud to have opened for a safe, fun, and COVID-free summer in 2020. We are excited to open again this summer on **June 7, 2021**.

In accordance with the most recent recommendations set forth by the CDC, the Florida Department of Health, and our local government agencies, the Tampa JCCs & Federation has implemented necessary changes to the camp program in order to safely engage our campers. The situation is fluid; updates and changes to these policies may occur.

1. PRE-SCREENING STAFF AND CAMPERS

- Temperatures will be taken and health safety questions will be asked while each camper is in the parent's vehicle; any camper with a temperature above 100.3°F or any symptoms will not be allowed to attend Camp J that day.
- Staff will have their temperatures taken prior to entering the building as well as a questionnaire before joining campers; any staff with a temperature above 100.3°F or yes to any of the screening questions will not be allowed to work at Camp J that day.
- If your child is exhibiting any symptoms (see #2), please keep him or her home.
- Campers and staff must be symptom-free for 24 hours before returning to Camp J.
- A current and up to date immunization record must be submitted for each camper- see "Welcome Packet."

2. CHILDREN BECOMING ILL AT CAMP

- Any child that is displaying symptoms of illness, including but not limited to: fever, coughing, shortness of breath, chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell, or lethargy, will be removed from the group and will go to the designated isolation room; he or she will remain there until a parent or guardian picks them up. Parents are required to pick up symptomatic children immediately.

3. GROUP SIZE

- We will be limiting group sizes in accordance with CDC recommendations.

4. DROP OFF AND PICK UP PROCEDURES

Parents may NOT enter the building

- Parents must drop off and pick up children in their car through the designated area at all times. As per our usual camp policy, only authorized individuals will be permitted on campus to drop off or pick up children.
- If you arrive before or after designated drop off or pick up times, we ask that you contact us in advance via the Remind App; we will meet you outside to pick up or drop off your child.

5. HAND WASHING

- Hand sanitizing stations will be set up throughout Camp J.
- Staff and campers will wash their hands every hour.

6. PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

- Staff will be required to wear a face mask throughout the day while indoors. While outdoors masks must be worn if not 6 feet apart from others and not participating in cardio activity.
- All campers must wear face coverings throughout the day while indoors. While outdoors, masks must be worn if not 6 feet apart from others and not participating in cardio activity. Masks will be made available, but we encourage campers to bring their own.

7. LUNCH

Campers should bring a dairy lunch from home each day. It is the parent's responsibility to clean and sanitize the lunch box and reusable items before returning the following day. Pre-packaged snacks will be provided during the camp day.

8. WATER

For health and safety purposes, the water fountains will be closed and not available for use. Children should bring a labeled (first and last name) reusable water bottle for drinking use throughout the day. It is the parent's responsibility to clean and sanitize water bottles before returning the following day. Campers will have the opportunity to refill water throughout the day. Cups will be provided if they forget or misplace their water bottle.

9. CLEANING AND DISINFECTING

- Equipment and materials will be sanitized between usages with disinfectants recommended by the EPA.
- Campers will not be allowed to share personal items.

10. ACTIVITIES

- Campers will enjoy sports through skills and drills as well as socially distant games.
- Most field trips will take place at outdoor venues; some will take place on campus.
