# Moments that brighten our community

Jewish Federation & Foundation of Greater Toledo fostered connection, tradition, and Jewish pride across every generation in 2024.

**1,156 individuals** attended events across Greater Toledo.

**36+ baseballs** signed by Jewish former MLB player Ryan Lavarney served as lasting mementos of Jewish pride and inspiration.

**12+ hours** of Jewish cinema illuminated stories and sparked meaningful conversation.

**1,200 pages** were turned during the Toledo Jewish Book Festival author talks, deepening engagement with Jewish literature and thought.

**115+ events** reached participants from **ages 0 to 96**, celebrating every stage of the Jewish journey.

“My teacher taught me when I was little.”

With questions like this, a group of 3-year-olds sparked beautiful conversations about Jewish traditions passed down through generations.

**Heartwarming Moments:** *A smile spreads across Leo’s face as his friends’ voices fill the phone, singing him our special Get Well Song. At Gan Yeladim, when a friend is home sick, our teacher helps us reach out with kindness.*

With his sharp “I Spy” eyes he had spotted a perfectly camouflaged praying mantis blending into a wooden beam. His keen observation turned an ordinary moment into a thrilling nature discovery.*

**Kindness & Empathy in Action:** At Gan Yeladim we cherish kindness, empathy, and the warmth of friendship. Sometimes, the smallest acts of care make the biggest difference.

# Nurturing and guiding the changemakers of tomorrow



JFGT shines a guiding light for families with young children, illuminating a joyful path to Jewish connection through innovative and engaging experiences.

**Over 75 hours of family engagement** brought **300+ participants** together through playdates as well as music, tumbling, art, cultural, and holiday-based programming, lighting the way for Jewish families to connect and grow.

**100+ latkes** eaten at Latkes and Lights united the community in celebration and tradition.

**1,500+ PJ Library books**, made possible by the Inspiration Fund, were delivered to **120+ children**, offering families stories that inspire a deep and joyful connection to Judaism.

**200+ tiny fingers and toes** explored Jewish values through PJ Playdates, fostering early curiosity and belonging.

**25+ future Jewish leaders** from BBYO participated in local, regional, and international programs, strengthening their Jewish identity and building connections that will shine for years to come.

**\$71,000+** from the Long-Term Community Needs Fund and **\$8,000** from the Jewish Experience Fund helped **44 Jewish Toledo campers** attend overnight camp, **8 of them for the first time**, igniting lifelong connections to Jewish life.



JFGT's *Experience a Memorable Overnight Jewish Initiative (EMOJI)* offers children between the ages of 7 and 16 the opportunity to experience a life-changing Jewish overnight camping experience.

# Igniting passion for Jewish life

## Hillel419

By nurturing the spark within Jewish young adults, Hillel419 has kindled a vibrant, compassionate, and inclusive Jewish future in Toledo. These young adults carry the light of our community forward for generations to come.

**94%** of Jewish students confirmed that being Jewish will continue to be important to them after graduation.

**67 relationships** were built or strengthened with people who work at The University of Toledo (UT) and Bowling Green State University (BGSU).

**222 programs** and **67 on-campus events** at UT and BGSU brought Jewish life to campus and helped inspire more students to create a connection to Jewish life.

**52 weeks** of Friday Hillel419 Shabbat dinners provided a sense of community and belonging. **180+ hours** of community service spread light and kindness.

**150+ cups of coffee** engaged Hillel419 students and cultivated a Jewish community on the UT and BGSU campuses.

**14 young adults** participated in Alternative Spring Break to Give Kids the World. **23 young adults** served in leadership roles. **390 young adults** participated in Hillel419 programs. **30 young adults** participated in ongoing Jewish learning opportunities.

**7 grants** were awarded to Hillel419. **\$16,936** was raised on Giving Tuesday. **\$15,000** was raised during BGSU’s One Day – the University’s dedicated day of giving. **3 new major donors** joined the Hillel419 campaign.

**1 Hillel baby** was born.





# Offering a beacon of support and care



Jewish Senior, Family & Social Services (JSFSS) provides caring, professional services across greater Toledo, bringing warmth, dignity, and strength to the lives of children, adults, families, and seniors. With every connection, JSFSS is committed to illuminating pathways for those navigating economic and social challenges, standing as an unwavering source of hope, outreach, advocacy, and support for the most vulnerable in our Jewish community.

**2,359** individuals received food, hygiene products, and other pantry services through **876** appointments.

**60+** Jewish individuals and families received at-home technology assistance and small group training. **675+** individuals participated in Jewish-related virtual reality sessions and technology-focused programs.

**250+** meals were delivered to community members in need of short-term nutritional assistance, including more than **\$7,000** in Mitzvah Meals grants to Temple Shomer Emunim.

**5** Create & Relate events embraced **150+** adults interested in improving their mental health and well-being. The 2nd annual Senior Expo shined.

**360** fitness classes welcomed **2,283** attendees.

**300+** Jewish seniors journeyed near and far (Detroit, Indiana, Cleveland), enjoying a connection to theater, sports, and community.

**800+** individuals received assessments, support, subsidies, advocacy, care management, or other vital services through JSFSS.

**500+** home and facility visits by staff and patient advocates ensured no one was left in the shadows.

**250+** rides to doctor appointments, physical therapy, congregational services, community programs, and more provided reliability.





# Local & global resilience



Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC) represents the Greater Toledo Jewish community, Israel, and Jews by illuminating paths of connection with the broader community; building bridges with diverse ethnic, racial, civic, and religious groups; promoting interests through government relations at the Federal, State, and local levels and with the media; and educating/advocating on important issues, seeking consensus while staying true to Jewish values. In June, Amichai Stout became JCRC's new Director. Amichai focused on fostering education and Jewish unity amidst the global rise in antisemitism.

## Key initiatives in 2024 included:

Welcoming Congresswoman Marcy Kaptur, State Senator Paula Hicks-Hudson, and local leaders to discuss important community matters.

Engaging **500+** attendees in Israel and antisemitism-related educational events, featuring:

- A delegation of IDF soldiers visiting for Yom HaZikaron.
- A community vigil to mark the one-year anniversary of the October 7 attacks.
- Dinner with Chef Uri from the Western Galilee Partnership2Gether region.
- Adina Kanefield, CEO of the National Library of Israel's USA division, discussing the library's efforts to document October 7 and the rise of global antisemitism.
- Hailey Stern from StandWithUs presenting a guide on distinguishing antisemitism from legitimate criticism of Israel.
- Fireside Chat series on topics like Israeli Judaism, the Israeli government, and the complex Israel-Palestine dynamic.

Hosting model Passover seders with **120+** participants.

Presenting the annual Diversity Day, with guest speaker and survivor, Rodi Glass, educating 800+ high school students about the Holocaust.

Rebuilding relationships with the local Muslim community following the October 7 events and engaging in two interfaith panels to discuss Judaism, Islam, and the ongoing Israel-Hamas war.

# Safeguarding our community's institutions



- **141 hours** of contracted police protection were provided at **30 JFGT events** with additional hours in support of local congregational services, events, trainings, and security updates at the Sekach Building, Congregation B'nai Israel, Temple Shomer Emunim, Congregation Etz Chayim, Chabad House of Greater Toledo, Lourdes University Franciscan Center, and more.
- Security Director Dave Tullis led **12+ trainings** for JFGT staff, Chabad, cemetery staff, and community members, covering active shooter response, Stop the Bleed, OSHA compliance, bomb threat and swatting response, DHS and FBI procedures, and ORIC security training.
- JFGT offices were equipped with FLOCK License Plate Readers, Beth Shalom Cemetery installed Verkada cameras and 6-foot spear-top fencing, Eagle Point Cemetery added similar fencing, and Hillel419 enhanced surveillance and access control with exterior cameras and security-rated doors. These upgrades help keep our spaces safe for worship, learning, celebration, and remembrance.

### ENSURING THE SAFETY AND SECURITY OF OUR JEWISH COMMUNITY



Over **\$50,000** has already been distributed to local partners, including Chabad of Toledo, Congregation B'nai Israel, Congregation Etz Chayim, and Temple Shomer Emunim.



In 2024, JFGT launched the first phase of its three-year LiveSecure Matching Security Campaign to enhance Jewish Toledo's safety. With **\$115,000** raised and **\$92,000** pledged, only **\$48,000** remains to meet the \$255,000 goal. Funds support security system upgrades, guards, training, emergency preparedness, and law enforcement coordination.

**In response to the dangerous rise in anti-Jewish violence, the Jewish Federations of North America (JFNA) launched LiveSecure.**

**What is LiveSecure?** LiveSecure is an unprecedented \$54 million matching security campaign and initiative to ensure the security and resiliency of Jewish communities across the nation.

Created in collaboration with the Secure Community Network (SCN) – the official homeland security and safety arm of the organized North American Jewish community – LiveSecure will ensure that Jewish Federation of Greater Toledo and every community in the Federation system, will have a quality, best-practice local community security initiative in place within three years.

Your generosity and commitment to the security of Jewish Toledo, with the funding that a LiveSecure grant provides together with the expertise of SCN, will enable us to have all the necessary resources to support the work of the initiative. But we need your help to make it happen.

# Ensuring our financial resources reflect and meet evolving Jewish needs



The 2024 Annual Campaign raised **\$1,167,819** from **816 donors** (12% more donors than 2023)

- **90%** of donations supported local community needs, including:
  - **Safety and security** for our JFGT campus and Jewish institutions; Jewish Community Relations Council; JSFSS Family Food Pantry; Friendship Circle (in part); *Toledo Jewish News*; Jewish senior programs; Gan Yeladim Preschool; B'nai B'rith Youth Organization (BBYO); Hillel419; Young Leadership/Professionals; Toledo Jewish Community Cemetery Association; and community programs
- **10%** of donations supported charities in Israel and other overseas allocations, including:
  - ORT's YOUNiversity program in Matte Asher, which provides STEAM education after school
  - Youth Futures (part of The Jewish Agency for Israel) in Akko's mentorship programs for kids in need
  - JDC-Israel to support a Haredi workforce and mental health programs (Derech Eretz)
  - Dror Israel's Akko Educators Kibbutz program for immigrants from the former Soviet Union (including a one-time gift to Dror Israel for a summer camp organized for Ukrainian refugee children)
  - Western Galilee Partnership2Gether (through the Jewish Agency for Israel)
- **345** Women's Philanthropy Donors
  - **9** Lion of Judah Endowments, gifts in perpetuity currently providing a lasting legacy
    - **52** Lion of Judah Donors, women who give **\$5,000+** each year
    - **58** Pomegranates, women who give **\$1,800 - \$4,999** each year
    - **226** Pearls, women who give **\$180 - \$1,799** each year

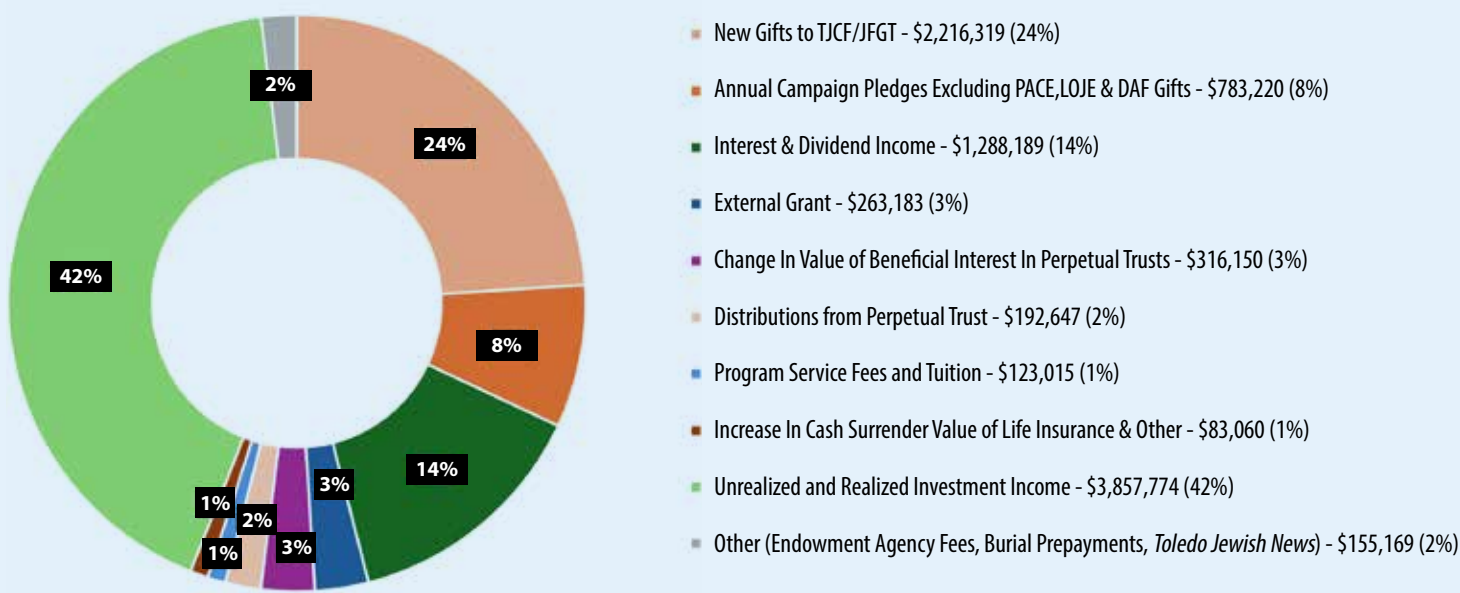

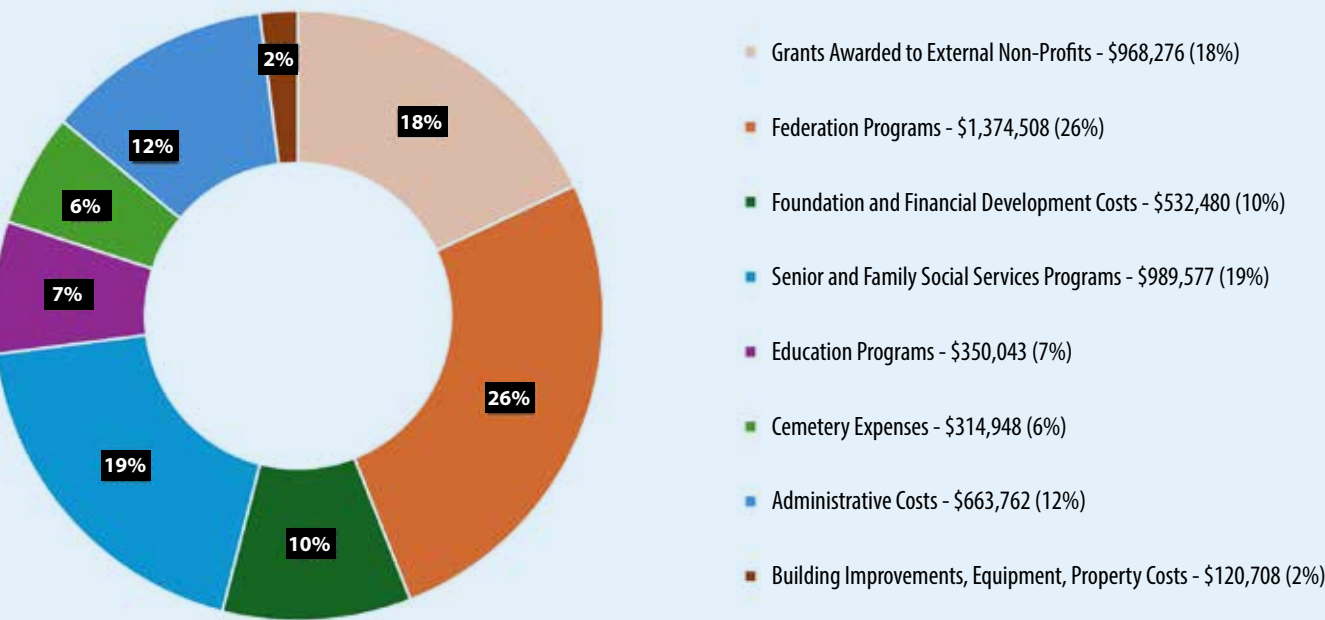

2024 Expenses - \$5,314,302

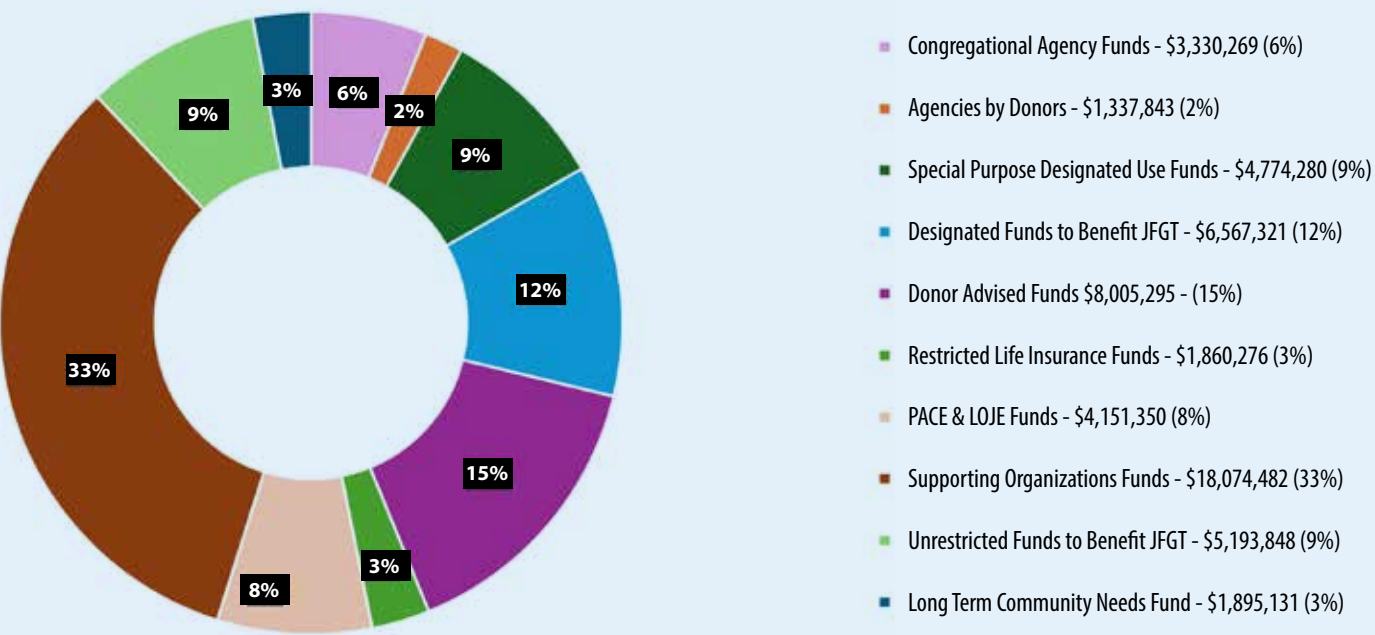
2023 Expenses - \$5,797,191

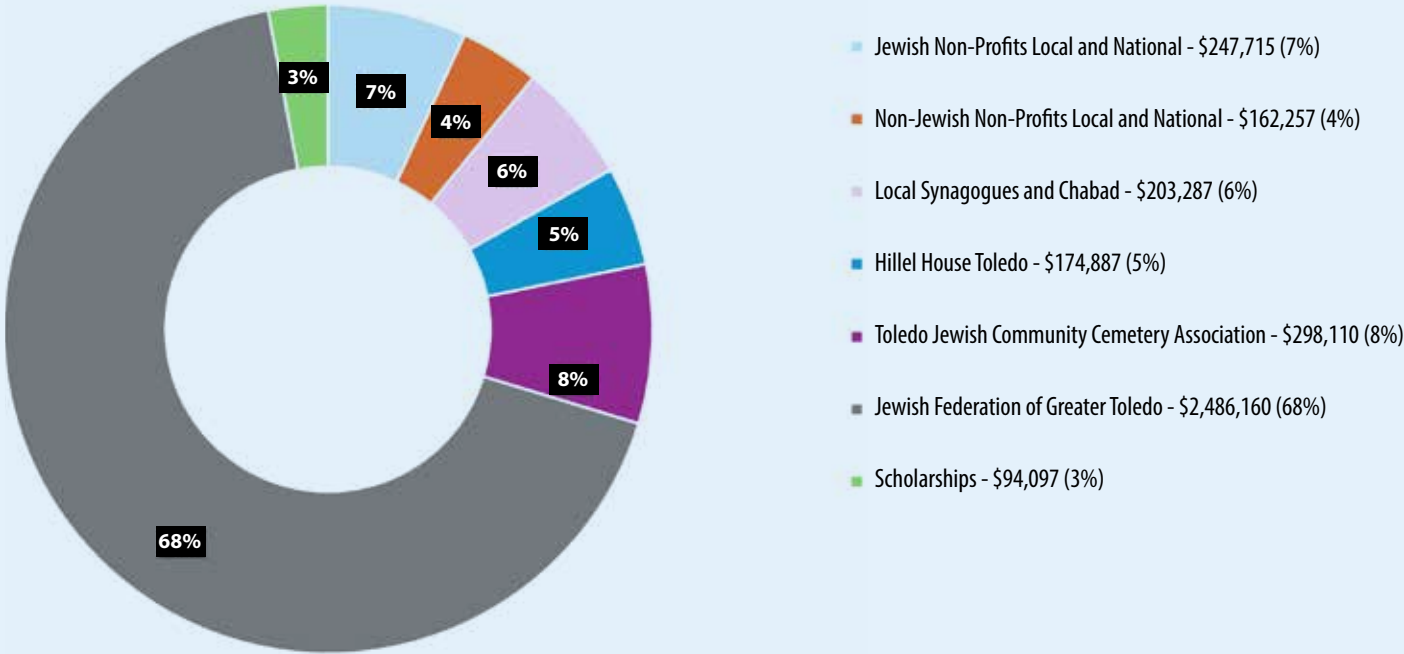

# Leadership Awards



## Harry Levison Young Leadership Award

Created in 1962, the Harry Levison Young Leadership Award rewards exceptional service from young adults of outstanding promise and leadership ability who exhibit an active interest in Jewish Federation and Foundation of Greater Toledo (JFGT) and the community Annual Campaign.



### Rosemary Chaban

Rosemary Chaban is a Sylvania native and Northview High School graduate. She currently practices as a General Dentist in Sylvania, with a focus on TMJ disorders and orofacial pain alongside her partner. Rosemary began her service with the Jewish Senior, Family & Social Services (JSFSS) board and now serves as Chair. She has been an active volunteer with the Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC) for four years and leads modified yoga classes. In 2025, she will join the JFGT executive board as Secretary. Rosemary volunteers with dental organizations on both local and national levels. She currently serves as Secretary of the Access to Continuing Care (ATCC) Committee within the American Academy of Orofacial Pain (AAOP). Together with her husband, Ido Rottem, she looks forward to expanding their community involvement and developing new programs.

## Shining Light Awards

Created in 2019 to recognize outstanding community volunteers who find meaning and reward in giving of their time and energy for the greater good of Jewish Federation and Foundation of Greater Toledo (JFGT).



### Gary Franks

Gary Franks, a retired SSOE engineer, has been a dedicated volunteer with the Wood County Genealogical Society and Toledo Jewish Community Cemetery Association (TJCCA) for over a decade. In 2014, he documented over 3,600 burials in 14 inactive cemeteries and helped recover lost records for Eagle Point Cemetery after a system crash. He recovered more than 170 previously unrecorded Lucas County burials from 1868–1940, delivering updated records and maps to TJCCA in 2015. In 2017, Gary co-founded the Lucas County Cemeteries Historical Association (LCCHA) and serves as its official cartographer. He created over 700 maps covering 67 of Lucas County’s 77 cemeteries and reconstructed lost burial records for Forest and Swan Creek Cemeteries, dating as far back as 1825. In 2023, Gary helped research and map Beth Shalom Cemetery in Oregon, Ohio.



### Jodie Goldstein

Before having children, Jodie Goldstein spent ten years teaching religious school. Later she co-taught the Temple Tots program at Temple Shomer Emunim for several years. A few years ago, her family hosted a ShinShinim (Israeli year-of-service participant) who visited Toledo while spending a service year in Cleveland. Jodie currently serves on the Jewish Federation of Greater Toledo’s Book Festival Committee and will join the Board of Trustees at Temple Shomer Emunim this fall. For several years, she and her husband, Marshall, have volunteered together at St. Paul’s Community Center on behalf of Temple Shomer Emunim. She concluded her tenure as BBYO City Director in December 2024. Jodie is an Intervention Specialist and the Special Education Department Chair at Larchmont Elementary School. She has served as the school’s Claire’s Day representative for the past five years and actively supports political action initiatives through the Toledo Federation of Teachers. She is also in the process of becoming a foster for the Ability Center’s Assistance Dog Program.

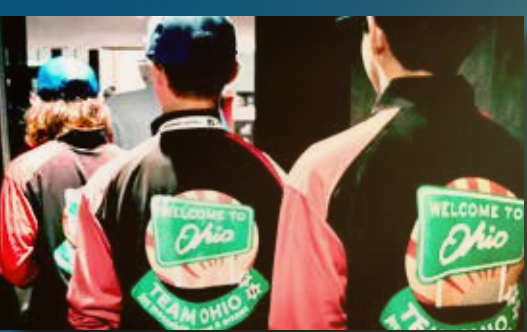
